What is Snap Scene?

- Snap Scene is an AAC solution designed specifically for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and others at the beginning stages of learning communication who:
 - do not speak
 - may be slower in learning to talk
 - may speak but are difficult to understand
 - are at risk for communication challenges
- Snap Scene is **accompanied by Pathways**, which supports parents and therapists as they help children grow communication and language skills.
- The Snap Scene design and concepts and strategies in Pathways are **based on the research** by Janice Light and Kathryn Drager
- The purpose of Snap Scene is to **build communication, language and literacy skills** by introducing AAC in every day social and play interactions that are fun and motivating.

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What is ALL?

- Accessible Literacy Learning (ALL) is an evidence-based, instructional program ***designed specifically to meet the needs of individuals with communication impairments and therefore does not require verbal productions***
- ALL was ***developed in partnership*** with Janice Light and David McNaughton
- ALL was evaluated in a 5-year research grant involving a wide range of participants with complex communication needs, including learners with autism, cerebral palsy, Down Syndrome, developmental apraxia, and multiple disabilities. ***Every participant successfully acquired conventional literacy skills.***
- ***ALL is NOT just for individuals with AAC needs***, it supports literacy instruction for all types of learners by focusing on the basics skills required for reading.



What does it work on?

- **Sound-Blending** (essential for reading): the ability to build words from individual sounds by blending the sounds together in sequence.
- **Phoneme Segmentation** (essential for writing): the ability to break words down into individual sounds.
- **Letter-Sound Correspondence** (essential for reading and writing) – Recognize sounds represented by each of the letters and vice versa.
- **Single Word Decoding** (essential for reading): Apply knowledge of letter-sound correspondences and sound blending skills to “sound out” regular words. If students learn to decode, they will be able to read new words.
- **Sight Word Recognition** (essential for reading): Recognize a word without sounding it out (e.g., light, dinosaur). Not all written words are regular ones that can be decoded easily.
- **Shared Reading** (essential for reading comprehension): Decode or recognize each word in sequence, access the meaning of the words/sentences, process the words/sentences together in sequence to derive the full meaning of the text.

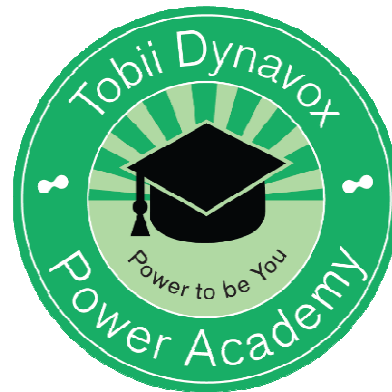
